LEARN ABOUT OUR NEW WATER TREATMENT PLANT

The Queen Street Water Treatment Plant began supplying water to the City of Yorkton distribution system in January 2011.

Yorkton's water is continually tested to make sure it meets or exceeds Saskatchewan's Drinking Water Quality Standards and Objectives.

Whenever you turn on your tap you can be confident that the water is safe and ready to use.

What is Chlorination?

It is the process of adding the element chlorine to water as a method of water purification to make it fit for human consumption as drinking water. Water which has been treated with chlorine is effective in preventing the spread of waterborne disease.

Is my tap water safe to drink?

Yes! To ensure the purity of our water, we test the water continuously during and after treatment. In fact, we conduct more tests and on many more substances than required by regulation. At the City of Yorkton, we take drinking water samples daily to confirm the absence of bacteria.

We use only the necessary chemicals to treat the water, including chlorine, to kill bacteria that may be present. A small amount of chlorine is left in the water to ensure its continued safety as it travels to you.

Do I need to have my water tested?

No, Yorkton's municipal tap water is regularly tested and monitored; it meets and/or exceeds all regulations from the Ministry of the Environment.
