BYLAW NO. 3/96

A BYLAW OF THE CITY OF YORKTON TO DESIGNATE
CERTAIN PROPERTY AS MUNICIPAL HERITAGE PROPERTY

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Yorkton in the Province of Saskatchewan in accordance with *The Heritage Property Act* and in Council assembled enacts as follows:

1. Legal Description - Lot 40 and the north ½ of Lot 41
Block 11
Plan 27474
(Yorkton, Saskatchewan)

Civic Description - 81 Second Avenue N.
Yorkton, Saskatchewan

Registered Owner - Brian and Brenda Beisel

Reasons for the designation are as follows:

- a) There are no other existing homes of this combined architectural style, age and historical significance. The building has been restored to its original form.
- b) This home was built for Dr. C.M. Henry who brought Yorkton's first x-ray machine into his home/office to serve the people of Yorkton.
- c) On the recommendation of the Municipal Heritage Advisory Commission, the City of Yorkton is requested to designate this property for preservation as a Municipal Heritage site. This house scored 100% on the Heritage and Viability Assessment Grading System.
- d) This building is located in a residential area and is currently used solely as a residential home. The owners have requested the Municipal designation and will maintain and upkeep the building's originality and excellent order.
