### Bylaw # 38/2003

#### Places

- ▶ The Smoking Bylaw prohibits smoking by the public in all workplaces and public places. This includes **all** Public Places and WorkPlaces including bars, restaurants, retail shops, hairdressers, bowling alleys, bingo halls and casinos. There is no provision for a designated smoking area. Outdoor patios are allowed if they meet the requirements of the bylaw.

#### Responsibilities of Owners, Managers and Employers

- ▶ All owners, managers and employers must ensure that proper signage is in place prior to July 1, 2004 as outlined in the bylaw.
- ▶ Must remove all ashtrays. Other receptacles cannot be used for cigarette or cigar ashes or butts.
- ▶ Must not condone smoking by the public in their establishment.

#### Duties of the Public

- ▶ No person is to smoke in a public place or workplace as described in the bylaw.

#### Enforcement

- ▶ Enforcement will generally be complaint driven. Public Health Inspectors and Bylaw Enforcement Officers may do inspections as required under the law.

#### Penalties

- ▶ Penalties may range from a warning letter to an amount of \$10,000 for individuals and from a warning letter to an amount of \$25,000 for businesses.
