

Columbarium FAQ

1) What is the Columbarium?

 A columbarium is a structure that is used to store urns containing cremated remains. It encompasses designated areas called a Niche, which holds the urn and has a plaque the helps remember and memorialize a loved one.

How big is a Niche?

- Each niche is 10" x 10" square with 14" front to back
- This accounts for the 12" x 12" granite plaque's frame.

3 How many urns can go into a niche?

- The City of Yorkton does not currently define the number of urns placed in a niche, however fees and charges vary depending on the opening and closing requirements.
- A niche will accommodate as many urns as will fit within the dimensions of 10" x10" x 14".

What is included in the cost of a niche?

- The first inurnment is included in the purchase price.
- The engraving is included in the purchase price.
- The price of a niche is comparable to the fees associated to a cremation interment within the ground at the City of Yorkton Cemetery.
- Any additional urns may be placed within the Niche, but are subject to opening and closing fees as well as Care and Maintenance and Perpetual Care Fees.

5) How do I inscribe my Columbarium niche?

- Inscriptions will be engraved to the front of the niche spaces. They will all have a consistent design.
- Inscriptions may be arranged through the City of Yorkton Cemetery Administration Office at 306-828-2452 or cemeteryadmin@yorkton.ca.

(6) What can I inscribe on my Columbarium plaque?

- To maintain the columbarium in a uniform manner, the City of Yorkton will arrange for the engraving of the plaque.
- The name, birth date and death date of the person(s) inurned will be engraved on the plaque. The fee for this is included in the niche purchase price.

7) Is there a special kind of urn that we must used?

- We recommend the use of urns made of ceramic, metal, composite or another non-combustible material.
- Your local funeral provider will have a selection of cremation urns available for purchase.
