BYLAW NO. 28/89

A BYLAW OF THE CITY OF YORKTON TO DESIGNATE CERTAIN PROPERTY AS MUNICIPAL HERITAGE PROPERTY.

The Council of the City of Yorkton in accordance with the Heritage Property Act enacts as follows:

1. That the property described as follows be designated as Municipal Heritage Property.

Legal - Lots One (1), and Two (2), Block 10, Plan 20767. Yorkton, Saskatchewan.

Civic description - 49 Smith Street East, Yorkton, Saskatchewan.

Registered Owner: City of Yorkton.

- 2. Reasons for the designation are as follows:
 - a) Built in 1907 and 1908 as a fireproof building to house title papers for the lands of the district as well as the Dominion Lands Office for a wider area.
 - b) All interior doors are original sheathed copper.
 - c) Other interior highlights include a decorative bronze rail around the marble steps to the basement.
 - d) The building was originally a square shape until the south portion was added in the 1930's.
 - e) Decorative brick and molding give it the identity that other Land Titles Buildings possess.
