#### **BYLAW NO. 13/92**

## A BYLAW OF THE CITY OF YORKTON TO DESIGNATE CERTAIN PROPERTY AS MUNICIPAL HERITAGE PROPERTY

The Council of the City of Yorkton in accordance with the Heritage Property Act enacts as follows;

1. That the property described as follows be designated as Municipal Heritage Property:

Legal - Lot 16, Block 2, Plan 33277 (Yorkton, Saskatchewan)

Civic Description - 29 Myrtle Avenue, Yorkton, Saskatchewan.

Registered Owner: City of Yorkton

- 2. The reasons for the designation are as follows:
  - a) that the home was built by the Doukhobor's and the home and garage were constructed of brick which was manufactured by the Doukhobor Brickyard Society.
  - b) built to resemble the thatch and peaked roof dwellings of their homeland, the homes had exterior walls which were 3 bricks thick and were surrounded by 51 high brick/wood fences.
  - c) all construction was performed by hand.
  - d) of the six original homes, only three remain today; one of which is 29 Myrtle Avenue North.
  - e) On the recommendation of the Commission, the City purchased the property for preservation as a municipal heritage site.
  - f) There are no other homes of similar style elsewhere in the province.
