### **Trans Canada Trail Extended Through Yorkton**

The Trans Canada Trail (TCT) has officially been extended through the City of Yorkton, following Gladstone Avenue from southern side of the city where it enters from York Lake, to the north side through the RM of Orkney and on to Canora. City Trails along Logan Green, the Ravine Ecological Preserve and Jaycee Beach had previously been designated part of the trail but were not officially linked.

Council approved the extension of the trail through the city in order to help complete the TCT across the country prior to the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Confederation in 2017. Signage designating the trail extension will be posted this Spring.

“We are very happy to endorse this extension to the Trans Canada Trail through Yorkton, and to join the various city trails already designated as part of the route,” said Deputy Mayor Randy Goulden.

Yorkton was one of the first communities in the area to designate trails as part of the TCT, but as surrounding municipalities finalized their routes, the trail now enters the City at different locations than was anticipated in 1999 when the existing Yorkton trail sections were designated.
