Yorkton Parks **TECH TIP** Tree Worms

What's the issue?

Tent Caterpillars are expected to occur again this year, however, not as significantly as past years. They feed initially on the opening buds, later consuming the whole leaf of broad-leaved trees and shrubs.

What can residents do in their yard?

1. Prune or break off the egg masses on the twigs and branches, seal in a bag or container and dispose of them in the garbage. The best time to do this is early spring when the eggs are clearly visible.
2. After hatching, young larvae colonies can be pruned off or squished while they are resting in clusters on the main stem, especially in the evening or on cool nights.
3. Band your trees before worms become a problem. Tanglefoot is an environmentally friendly way to keep worms from climbing the trees. **Remember to remove the band by the end of June to prevent rotting bark.**
4. Non-chemical insecticides that contain BTK are an environmentally friendly way to control tree worms.
5. Chemical agents may also be sprayed to control. **Remember to always follow the manufacturer's label when using chemicals.**

What is the City doing?

The City of Yorkton has a tree worm control program in place. At the first sighting of tree worms, the Parks Division begins preparations for spraying City owned trees. Initial spraying uses a product called Dipel, which contains BTK. This product must be ingested, and is sprayed onto the leaves when the worms are feeding. During heavy infestations, a second spraying of a chemical insecticide called Pounce may be used, which begins working on contact with the worm.
